



## Camper Car – What You Need To Know

### Cooker:

- Never use the cooker inside the case or the vehicle.
- The gas canister must be taken out after each use.

### Curtains:

- The thermo-insulated curtains use suction cups to stick to your windscreen and front windows.
- Wetting the suction cups will help them to stay in place.
- Clean window with glass cleaner (alcohol based).

### Chiller:

- Your vehicle is fitted with a chiller, this should not be left plugged into the cigarette lighter socket for more than 3 hours when the vehicle is switched off. Failure to do so may damage your vehicle's battery.

### Side Awning:

- The side awning works just like an umbrella.
- Extending the legs fully will lock them in place
- Erect the awning away from the car and then bring it to the side of the car with the sliding door.
- Align the metal loops on the roof with the awning straps. Put the long strap through the metal loop, through the nylon loop on the awning, and then back through the metal strap. Pull hard to tighten and tie off.
- Peg down the awning and clip on the side panels if required.





### **Driving:**

- The fuel type will be displayed inside the fuel cap (diesel) and on your rental agreement. The fuel flap opens manually. The fuel cap is opened with the car key
- For reverse press the gear lever down and then to the left.
- Be careful of the blind spot on the passenger side.
- Auto stop

### **Road Rules:**

- Drive on the left in the UK and Ireland &
- Drive on the right in continental Europe
- Speed limits are in Miles per hour in the UK. In Europe and Ireland they are in KM/H
- You can use the AA website for more information per country.

### **What to do if you have an accident**

If you and your Spaceship are involved in an accident, there are some basic things that will help you:

- Try to stay as calm as you can.
- Stop straight away and help anyone who's injured.
- Call an ambulance on 999 or EU 112 (or get someone to call an ambulance), if it's needed.
- Complete a European Accident Statement if the incident occurs outside of the UK. This document is required by law & both sides of the form should be completed & one part given to the third party driver.

Take clear images of:

- Damage caused to each of the vehicles including an image of the registration number
- If it is safe to do so, take photos of the scene of the accident to include road markings & any road signs plus the positions of the vehicles (or third party property) before they have been moved.
- If the third party is insured outside of the UK please try to take a clear photo of any insurance documents or "Green Card"
- Don't admit that the accident was your fault – it is important to look at all the available information following the stress of the accident. You may later find out other reasons why the accident occurred.
